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Background

Background

The projected occupancy date of September 2024 has been delayed due to challenges in the current construction environment for capital projects, including access to labour and materials. The targeted completion date has been moved to September 2025. The Board is proceeding with the review in 2023-2024 to identify the schools and students that will be impacted by this delay, as the Board may be required to develop temporary, short-term plans for those students and schools.



Community Engagement

Community Engagement

Based on the feedback received, as well as the uneven distribution of enrolment created by Options 1A and 1B, administration recommends that they be removed from consideration.

It was noted that many families voiced that they would prefer that the Grade 7-8 students from Central PS remain at Central PS.

It was also noted some families liked the idea of returning Grade 7-8 Enniskillen PS students to Enniskillen PS, while others preferred that the students continue to attend M.J. Hobbs Senior PS.

Based on feedback received, administration is recommending a hybrid approach to Options 2A, 2B, and 3.



Preferred Options – Central PS

The majority of feedback received from families indicated a preference for Grade 7-8 students to remain at Central PS.

A portable classroom has been placed on site for the 2023-2024 school year to accommodate an additional classroom required as enrolment grows at this school.

There is limited space for additional portable classrooms.

Central PS is projected to grow beyond the school and sites capacity to sustainably manage the enrolment growth.

If students were to remain at Central PS in 2025-2026, there remains the possibility that they mao-

Preferred Options – Central PS

Projections have been completed considering the phase out of out-of-boundary students as they graduate.

Hybrid options consider both scenarios, Central PS as a JK-Grade 8 school or as a JK-Grade 6 School

Preferred Options - Enniskillen PS

Enrolment projections were completed for Enniskillen PS:

Remaining status quo (i.e., Grade 7 and 8 students attend M.J. Hobbs Senior PS Enniskillen PS becoming a JK-Grade 8 school.

Relocating the Grade 7 and 8 students shifts the accommodation issue from M.J. Hobbs Senior PS to Enniskillen PS, therefore administration recommends that no changes be made to Enniskillen PS at this time.



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

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Next Steps

Two hybrid options have been presented.

Feedback will be collected at this community engagement meeting through the round table discussion, and an online ThoughtExchange until January 12, 2024.

Staff will review and summarize community feedback and identify the preferred option.

A final report will be produced with a summary of the engagement process, together with the preferred option for final approval by the Board of Trustees no later than March 2024.

An implementation/transition plan will be developed to support students, families and staff as they transition to their new schools.
